Healthy children have a better chance of learning.

Our Community Nurses work in partnership with parents, children and families offering support and advice with any physical, behavioural or emotional wellbeing issues you may have.

We can also liaise with and make referrals to other professionals. We will discuss their involvement with you and make a referral, if appropriate, with your consent.

Health promotion

We offer support in a variety of settings. This includes providing health information to children, young people and their families, and working with schools to identify health promotion/health improvement initiatives.

Confidentiality

All information received by the Community Nursing Service for School-Aged Children is treated as confidential, unless there are safeguarding concerns. Any information shared with relevant agencies will always be done in the best interests of your child.

Your GP will have arranged for your child to have a booster immunisation at around 4 years of age.

Further information about immunisations will be offered throughout your child's school life and are subject to change according to Department of Health recommendations. Some of these will be offered in school.
